With this sentence from the Lexical Approach, Michael Lewis emphasized the absurdity of teaching lexis in a decontextualized way through putting words and phrases in lists.






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WHAT KIND OF LISTS?

It depends on the nature of the "list" if a word can be remembered and made available for the learners' communicative needs or not.


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













How can you do things?

smile in a friendly way - she smiled at me in a friendly way singing loudly - They were singing loudly.






Dear Diary,


Today I had a job interview. I don't think I will get the job, because extremely many things went wrong.




