### Please pick one of the products for this project:

### 1. Create a poster (about size A1), or a photo book.

Take pictures of yourself and/or the places on your way to school (and add sentences to each photo. For more ideas look at Valentina's text no. 1332 on PALM again.

2. Create a short video clip

Use your cell phone to film yourself on your way to school. Describe where you are and what you are doing. Remember: the video should NOT be longer than 3 or 4 minutes.

Make a short film script before you start filming. Write down

- which places, situations you would like to film.
- what you would like to say in each situation.

You can also work in pairs to do this.

#### 3. Create a comic book.

3a. Make a comic book about your own way to school or interview a family member about their way to school and create a comic book about them. OR

3b. Pick one child or teenager you have watched in the videos or use this link to get information about another child or teenager: <u>https://www.wvi.org/asia-</u> pacific/article/12-incredible-journeys-school (If this link does not work, please google: 12 incredible journeys to school). Create a comic book about one of them. You can also work in pairs to do this.

### Prepare to present your product in class:

You can create a presentation or just show your video clip (with the film script), poster, photo book or comic book and say how you created it.

This is what you should say about it:

- How long did it take you?
- What were the fun parts?

(It took me...)

• What were the challenges?

(The fun parts were... I enjoyed ...) (The challenges were... It was difficult to ...)

• What would you do differently if you could start again?

(If I could start again I would...)

If you work in pairs you BOTH have to talk about this.

## ! Careful !

Whenever you take pictures or create a video,

### make sure that only you can be seen in it.

If you take pictures or make a video where other people can be seen ...

- ALWAYS tell them what you are doing.
- ALWAYS tell them why you are doing this.
- ALWAYS ASK IF IT IS OK FOR THEM TO BE IN THE PICTURE OR THE VIDEO. 0
