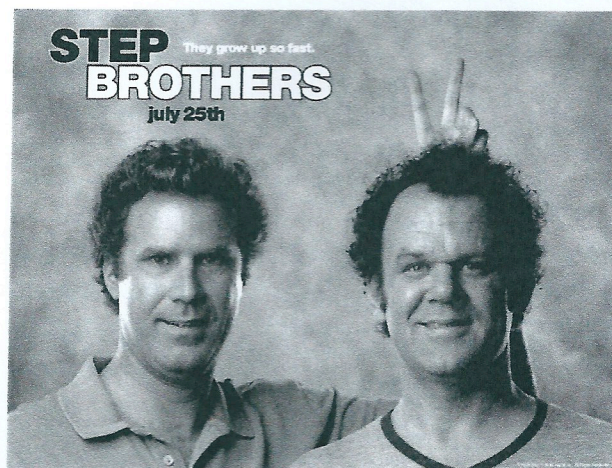


## Step Brothers

The production companies of "Step Brothers" are Gary Sanchez Production, Apatow Productions and Relativity Media and the produces are Jimmy Miller, who has produced Elf, which also stars Will Ferrell, The other guys, Get Smart and lots more. Judd Apatow was also a producer of the film and the founder of Apatow Productions, he has produced many famous films, such as Anchor-man, Walk hard and Train Wreck, starring Amy Schumer. The genre of the film is comedy and the screen play writers were Adam McKay and Will Ferrell, they also wrote the story line with help from John C.Rielly. It was filmed in Los Angeles, California, by Adam McKay from 4<sup>th</sup> September to the middle of December, with a budget of \$65 million (estimated), unfortunately I could not find whether it went over budget or not. The main stars of the film are: Will Ferrell who played Brennen Huff, John C.Reilly who was Dale Doback, Mary Steenburgen who played Nancy Huff, the mother of Brennen and the step-mother of Dale, Richard Jenkins who played Dr. Robert Doback, the father of Dale and the step-dad of Brennen and Adam Scott who was Derek Huff the brother of Brennen. The film was rated a 15 and an R for crude and sexual content, and pervasive language.



The distribution company was Colombia Pictures who did not release the film globally, it was shown in main stream cinemas from 25<sup>th</sup> of July 2008 to 19<sup>th</sup> September 2008, in the USA, for 1 hour and 38 minutes (rated) and 1 hour 48 minutes (unrated). It was released from the 25<sup>th</sup> of July 2008 in the USA until the 13<sup>th</sup> August in 2010 in Switzerland. The film showed 3,787 screens all over the world on the opening weekend and made \$30,940,732 on box office (opening weekend) and \$128,468,793 throughout the time that it was shown in cinemas. It made \$69,977,695 in DVD sales and the same for T.V video sales (in the USA). The promotion for the film was chat-show appearances, posters, with the tag line "They grow up so fast" and teaser trailers.
